How Then Do We Pray?

I was brought up to believe that extemporaneous prayers were the only way to pray. My experience as a student at Auckland Grammar School affirmed that. Most days at "Assembly" 1200 boys would mutter The Lord's Prayer together. Often I would stand next to friends that chanted the prayer in the morning and blaspheme God's Name when we met on the playing field. Clearly it meant nothing to them. Somehow that cemented the idea that all prayers need to be composed on the spot to be legitimate with God.

It's interesting that when Jesus taught his disciples to pray, in Luke's version (Luke 11:2 -4) he records Jesus saying; "When you pray, say: "Father, hallowed be your name..." His followers were invited to use these actual words as they prayed. In Matthew's account (Matthew 6:6-13), Jesus said," This is then how you should pray: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name." Maybe this indicates that we are free to use the "Our Father" as a guideline on how to pray. I may be pressing the point, but I'm convinced that God is blessed when I say the actual words of the prayer Jesus taught, and equally delighted when I use the words as a template on how to pray.

I'm convinced that individual Psalms were used as songs and prayers by groups of Jewish believers, as well as actual prayers of individuals. At Winston Churchill's funeral for example, the congregation in St. Paul's sang Isaac Watt's paraphrase of Psalm 90: "O God our help in ages past, our hope for years to come..." I love singing that hymn as a prayer. Time and again though, I've used the words of Psalm 90 as my actual prayer, discovering that Moses' prayer, captures thoughts and words I really wanted to pray. May I encourage you to take individual Psalms or the prayers of the Apostle Paul and pray God's words back to him - out loud.

Since the Scriptures were written, many believers have recorded their prayers. *Praying Great Prayers* contain a few of them. They are in no way a substitute for praying the prayers of the Bible back to God. They are just another form of prayer, as prayers made up on the spot do. I love the thought that at any time I can come and bring words freely to God; my own words. God is not waiting until I bring high-sounding prayers to him. He just wants to hear his children praise him. More recently I've discovered the joy of bringing ancient and more recent prayers to God. My hope and prayer is that some of these will capture thoughts that you have. Familiarize yourself with the three sections: Prayers of Worship and Adoration, Prayers of Confession, and Prayers for Transformation. Then from time to time use them in your times of meditation. As I've said about the Psalms, say them out loud. Maybe they will capture thoughts that you can't express unaided?

Never forget though to take the prayers of Scripture and either pray the actual words out loud to God, or use them as springboards to express what God has put on your heart.
